Getting Started

- Before starting be sure to read through pattern completely.
- Seam allowances are 1/4in, unless otherwise noted.
- Press seams open, unless otherwise instructed.
- RST = right sides together.
- WST = wrong sides together
- WOF = width of fabric.
- HST = half-square triangle.
- Width of Fabric assumes 42" wide fabric





Single Block Requirements for Mixing Fabrics

The Nordic Crossing Quilt Pattern is pieced diagonally in rows, not in the traditional block by block format. If you would like to mix and match fabrics for each block you will need: Star Block:

4 Flying Geese 1 Fabric D and 4 Fabric E

1 Square in Square 1 Fabric A, 2 Fabric B, and 1 Fabric C

4 Squares 4 Fabric I

Plus Block:

1 Fabric L

2 Strips H/G/H Fabrics Finished at 1 7/8" x 4 1/2"

1 Fabric F

Fabrics J and K are the background fabrics featured on the borders.

*** (1) Fat Quarter will yield:
(2) Two Square in Square Blocks
(8) Eight Flying Geese Blocks including (8) Corners for Star
(2) Plus Blocks






Assemble the Blocks


Square in a Square

- 1. Cut your 2 7/8" (Fabric B), 6 3/4" (Fabric J), and your 5 1/4" (Fabric K) background squares in half on the diagonal. Fig 1
- 2. Cut your 5 1/4" (Fabric C) accent squares in quarters on the diagonal. Fig 2
- 3. Sew (2) two background triangles (Fabric B) to the opposite sides of the Fabric A. Fig 3
- 4. Repeat for other two sides to form a 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" square. Press seams open. Trim the dog ears. Fig 4
- 5. Sew (2) two accent triangles (Fabric C) to the opposite sides of the Fig 4 units. Fig 5
- 6. Repeat for other two sides block. Press seams open. Trim the dog ears. Fig 5b
- 7. Repeat steps 1 6 to create the needed number of Square in a Square blocks of 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" unfinished size.












Flying Geese Blocks

- To make Flying Geese block you will need (1) 7" x
 7" square from Main Fabric D and (4) four 3 3/4"
 x 3 3/4" squares from background Fabric E.
- 2. Draw a line from one corner to the opposite corner on the reverse side of the four small squares (Fabric E).
- Place two small squares on the large square, RST and small squares in opposite corners as shown in Fig 6. The lines on the reverse sides of the small squares should connect together as shown. Fig 6a
- 4. Make sure all edges of fabrics are aligned. Secure the small squares with straight pins. Sew two seams, each a scant 1/4" away from the marked lines. Press the unit to set the seams (press flat, as-is, do not flip fabrics yet).
- 5. Cut the unit in half on the original drawn lines (Shown Right). Fig 6a
- 6. Press the triangles in each unit open Fig 6b






- 7. Place the two units created using the instructions in step 5 in front of you. Arrange a small square in the corner of each unit, RST, and marked lines positioned as shown in the right side of the illustration. Fig 6b
- 8. Sew two seams to attach the new squares to each unit, each a scant 1/4" away from the marked line—just as you did for the first squares. Press to set the seams.





- 9. Cut each unit apart on its original drawn line (midway between the seams).
- Press the triangles open to create four flying geese.
 Trim dog ears. Fig 6c
- 11. Repeat steps 2 10 to create the needed number of Flying Geese Blocks of 6 1/4" x 3 3/8" unfinished size.

Plus Blocks

- To make Plus Blocks sew (1) background (Fabric H)1
 7/8" x WOF strip to (1) color (Fabric G) 1 7/8" x
 WOF strip.
- 2. Sew (1) background (Fabric H) 1 7/8" x WOF to the bottom of the unit formed in step 1. Press seams open. Fig 7.
- 3. Cut the unit formed in step 2 into 1 7/8" x 4 1/2" strips.
- 4. Sew a strip unit formed in step 3 onto each of the long sides the 4 $1/2" \times 17/8"$ piece (Fabric L). Press seams flat. Fig 8
- Sew (2) two background triangles (Fabric F) to the opposite sides of the Plus Block unit formed in step 4.
 Fig 9
- 6. Repeat for other two sides of theunit. Press seams open. Trim the dog ears. Fig 9
- 7. Repeat steps 1 6 to creat the needed number of Plus Fig 7b Blocks 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" unfinished blocks.







Assembling The Quilt Top


- 1. Arrange quilt block units formed with the remaining squares and half square trinagles as shown.
- 2. Diagonally join the units into alternating vertical rows as shown below and then the rows together from left to right to complete the quilt top.
- 3. Trim the excess points of the guilt to square up the edges. Your guilt is now finished!




Quilting and Finishing

- 1. Cut the backing fabric to be 3 4" larger on each side then the quilt top, being sure to remove selvages. Press well
- 2. Press the quilt top well. Place the batting on the wrong side of the backing, then place the quilt top central and right side up forming a quilt sandwich. Baste the layers in place with your preferred method.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim the excess batting and backing even with the quilt top edges and square up the quilt.
- 5. Sew the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open and trim away the edges. Fold in half lengthwise, WST, and press.
- 6. Sew the binding to the right side of the quilt, fold a miter at each corner.
- 7. Fold the binding over to the back side and hand stitch binding in place to finish.
